Academic Vocabulary (1): Words that are spelled differently but sound the same

In this webinar, we will explore the difficulties that you may encounter when dealing with homophones. We will analyze groups of words such as “ate, eight” or “their, there, they’re” in order to understand their use in communication and the reasons behind their different spellings.

Academic Vocabulary (2): How to pronounce '-ed' at the end of a verb

At first glance all regular verbs have the same ending: ‘-ed’. It is a general misconception among students that all regular verbs endings are pronounced in the same way. Join this seminar if you want to get the right pronunciation of the past tenses and know a little bit more about phonetics.

Academic Vocabulary (3): How to pronounce '-s'/'-es' at the end of the word

This session looks at the various pronunciation of the present simple endings for the third person singular. It will review the various phonetic contexts that causes this phonemic variation and offer the opportunity of further supervised practice.

Academic Vocabulary (4): Pronouncing numbers

Pronouncing numbers in English can be difficult, especially if we take into account the big numbers. Furthermore, numbers are difficult to hear if they are said quickly or if they are very long. This session will use example and interactive activities in order to help you use and understand numbers with confidence.
